Warren served the 3rd District as Buddy Poppy Chairman, VOD Chairman, National Home Chairman, District Inspector, Teacher Award Chairman and National Home Chairman. His past National appointments are National Aide De Camp and Finance and Internal Organization Committee. Warren has been a part of the volunteer program at the Kansas Veteran’s Home in Winfield, Kansas, since it opened its doors, working in several different capacities with the residents and volunteers.
