### **Goff Re-Elected Secretary/Treasurer, National Home Board of Trustees**

**Eaton Rapids, Mich.** – Garry Goff of Eaton Rapids, Mich. has been re-elected Secretary/Treasurer of the VFW National Home for Children Board of Trustees by a vote of the 17-member Board. Goff was sworn in by Immediate Past Board President Mel Garrett at the National Home Annual Meeting of Life Members on Oct. 27.

Goff, an Army veteran, has been a member of the VFW for nearly 40 years. He joined the organization in 1968 and became a Life Member of the VFW in 1983. He is a member of Post #2406 of Charlotte, Mich.

Comrade Goff has lead the VFW on the Post, County Council, District and Department levels. His record of leadership includes Post #2406 Commander in 1991-1992, earning All-State Commander honors, Post #2406 Adjutant from 1992-1995 and 1999-2003, Commander of Eaton-Barry County Council in 1994-1995, District 8 Commander in 1998-1999, Department of Michigan Political Action Committee Chairman from 1996-1998 and 1999-2003 and Department of Michigan Hospital Chairman from 2000-2003. Goff has also been appointed to National Committees at the Washington Conferences and National Conventions of the VFW.

Comrade Goff has been a Life Member of the National Home since 1992. He has served as Post National Home Chairman from 1994-2003 and District National Home Chairman from 1994-2003. For almost 15 years, as a member of District 8, he has played Santa Claus during the annual Santa Firetruck Delivery. Goff also coordinates an annual gift of food gift certificates, movie tickets and other treats for the residents.

As Secretary/Treasurer, Goff will serve as the agent of the Board when they are not in session, signing documents and managing correspondence with the National Home's broad constituency. He will also attend all meetings of the Board, ensuring the business at hand is properly documented and recorded.
