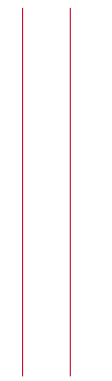
hope for struggling Families

Responding to Appeals – Because we usually have to ask for a donation to get a donation, the National Home mails many appeals throughout the year. Responding to one or more of them is greatly appreciated. Call if you wish to get only one (fall) or two (fall and spring) appeals a year.

Unique Ways to Give

Amazon.com Wish List – Buy something the National Home needs by going to www.amazon.com, clicking on Wish Lists in the lower left of the screen and searching for VFW National Home. Have the item shipped to the National Home and notify us via email or phone what is on its way. After an item is purchased, it falls off the list automatically. Using the registry eliminates us receiving duplicate items.

I Do Foundation – Getting married? Support the National Home by registering with the I Do Foundation. From honeymoons to invitations to wedding gifts to charitable wedding favors, the I Do Foundation allows couples and their guests to make wedding-related purchases that generate donations for charity. The I Do Foundation's Charity Registry service also makes it easy for guests to make donations in lieu of gifts. All of these services are available free of cost at www.IDoFoundation.org.

Special Times of the Year

Christmas

Christmas is a wonderful time at the National Home. However, one of the most difficult issues we face during this time is to ensure unrealistic expectations are not created for the children by overwhelming them with gifts. The National Home also strives to keep Christmas a time to focus on celebration and family—not material items. We also do not want to create a situation for a single parent where after they have graduated from our program and have moved away, the children become disappointed in what the parent can provide on their own. But, we also want and need the children and families to experience the joy of giving and receiving gifts.



So, at the National Home we focus on moderation. Items donated to the Home specifically for Christmas will be used in our Santa's Shop. Gifts of money to purchase Christmas gifts will be put into our Santa's Helper Fund, which also helps with travel expenses for children to visit family members around the country.

Just before Christmas, the Community Center auditorium becomes a store where the children may shop for friend and family gifts. Purchases at Santa's Shop are made using community service hours that residents have accrued throughout the year. Many opportunities, both on-campus and off, are offered to residents to build a savings account. Each item is priced in community service hour increments needed to buy the item.

The unusual aspect of this program is Santa's Shop needs gifts appropriate for all ages ; children may be shopping for moms, dads, grandmas, grandpas, big brothers, little sisters, best friends and other special people.

Promote your on-line fundraiser anytime from September 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008. Amy Ross Endowment Fund

In January 2008, a pledge of \$500,000 will be fulfilled establishing a new permanently restricted endowment fund. The Board of Trustees met a challenge from the donors to match this gift, which means in January 2008, this new fund will have a \$1,000,000 start.

The parents of Joseph Robert Blake chose to make this generous gift in his memory. Joseph was killed in action

while serving with A Company, 1st Battalion, 32nd Infantry, 10th Mountain division, U.S. Army during Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan. During his service, Joseph expressed concern about the families of those serving with him. By establishing this endowment fund, Joseph's parents hope to help continue the work of the National Home.

At the request of Joseph's parents, this new endowment is named after a very important person in the history of the National Home. It is named after Amy Ross, who in the early 1920s challenged the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States to help the families and children of veterans. The VFW and its auxiliary, The Military Order of the Cootie, responded to this challenge by creating The VFW National Home for Children.

The naming of this endowment fund after Amy Ross serves as a reminder that the challenge to serve the families and children of our nation's veterans is ever changing and forever needed. The gifts placed in this fund will generate annual income helping the National Home continue to meet Amy's original challenge.

Any gift designated for the Endowment Fund will be placed in this new fund. Life Membership fees will continue to be placed into the Life Membership Endowment Fund, which is restricted by the Board of Trustees.

You can leave the same kind of legacy by contributing to the Amy Ross Endowment Fund with a significant planned gift, outright gift, or bequest. Have your ultimate gift to the National Home benefit many generations of children and families.

Recognition Programs

Star Donor

Individuals are awarded Star Donor recognition for their cumulative giving for the calendar year. A special pin will be mailed in January for the 2007 year (if you want your pin sooner, just call us). The levels are:

- 1 Star - \$50 - \$99
- 2 Star = \$100 - \$249
- 3 Star - \$250 - \$499
- 4 Star - \$500 - \$999
- 5 Star - \$1,000 - \$4,999

6 Star - \$5,000+

Organizations are awarded a Star Donor plaque for their cumulative giving during the July – June year.

Bronze Star - \$500-\$999

Silver Star - \$1,000 - \$1,999

Gold Star – \$2,000 - \$4,999

Platinum Star - \$5,000+

Five Points Family

Each year, individuals are honored for their loyal giving when they reach a milestone of consecutive years of having given a cash gift. These milestones are 5, 10, 15, 20 and 25 years of consecutive giving. These people are truly dedicated and loyal National Home supporters.

Life Membership Awards

VFW Posts and Auxiliaries may receive a plaque recognizing the number of National Home Life Members that are a member of their Post or Auxiliary. The recognition levels are 25, 50, 100, 250, 500, 750 and 1,000 Life Members. Posts and Auxiliaries are encouraged to ask for a Life Membership report to determine if they are eligible for an award.

Departments that have at least 100 members become a National Home Life Member during the July-June year receive two special plaques honoring this achievement – one in the Commander/President's name and one in the Department National Home Chairman's name.
